Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Welcome to Term 3!

As always, in Term 3 we invite you to participate in the **Living Learning Leading Survey.**

To participate in this Parent and Caregiver Survey at St Martin's Catholic Primary School, Greenacres in 2025: go to www.NSIPartnerships.com.au and enter the code SMLLLP in the 'Start Questionnaire' field.

The survey takes between three and five minutes and is to find out about the performance of St. Martin's Catholic Primary School. This is an important opportunity for parents and caregivers to tell the school staff how things are going for you and your children. We value your feedback and will try to respond to the information that you provide.

Feedback we receive does NOT include the data of individuals; rather, feedback involves graphs based on feedback from all parents and caregivers. To ensure anonymity, aggregated scores are not provided for groups of less than four parents or caregivers. There are no right or wrong answers, but we value your opinions and are grateful for the few minutes you will give to doing this to help us improve our practices. If you have more than one child at St. Martin's, respond based on the experience of your oldest child at the school.

The response format requires parents and caregivers to consider the school's performance for each statement on a scale from 1 to 6 (with 1 being the lowest or worst score and 6 being the highest or best score).

At St. Martin's, this aligns with the OLSH pillar of **pursuing excellence**. Welcome to Term 3 and like Jesus we are inspired by Luke 10:38-42.

"But the Lord answered her, 'Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things; there is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her."

In this week's Gospel, we hear the familiar story of Martha and Mary, two sisters who welcome Jesus into their home. While Martha busies herself with preparing and serving, Mary sits with Jesus, listening closely to his words. Martha becomes frustrated, feeling overwhelmed and unnoticed. But Jesus gently reminds her and us that sometimes the most important thing is simply to be present, to listen, and to make space for others in a way that makes them feel truly seen and valued.

This Gospel reminds us that welcoming others is not just about doing it is about being with a kind smile, an open heart and a patient ear. These are all ways we can reflect the love of Jesus in our homes, classrooms and wider community.

As we welcome our new Transition class this term, this message feels especially important. Each new face brings an unique story, a new beginning, and a chance to grow together in faith and friendship. Let us extend the kind of welcome we would offer to Jesus himself — warm, joyful and full of kindness.

Sustainability

School Grants:

Our Sustainability Committee has been actively exploring grant opportunities to support and expand our environmental initiatives at school. Last term, two grant applications were submitted:

- A \$500 CESA Laudato Si' Grant, aimed at supporting small-scale projects that reflect our commitment to caring for creation.
- A larger grant through Credit Union SA, with the potential to receive up to \$20,000 to significantly enhance sustainability efforts across the school.

These funding opportunities would help bring to life a number of exciting projects that promote environmental stewardship, student engagement and outdoor learning. We remain hopeful and have our fingers crossed for a successful outcome for St Martin's!

School Frog Pond:

We are excited to share that Peter Kuerschner and Steve Walker from Green Adelaide have been working closely with our students to enhance our Sensory Garden through the development of a new pond and bog system being developed this term.

This hands-on project will offer students a unique opportunity to engage with sustainable design, environmental care, and biodiversity. Under Peter and Steve's expert guidance, students will be involved in every step from planning and preparing the space to learning about native water plants, habitats, and the role wetland systems play in supporting healthy ecosystems.

The addition of a pond and bog area will not only increase the sensory experiences available in the garden with sound, texture and movement but will also support local insect and frog populations, creating a living, learning environment right here at St Martin's.

To protect your anonymity, we do not report scores for groups of less than four parents or caregivers.

Use of the data

National School Improvement Partnerships will report the results to the school in an aggregated format. To enable drill-down reporting, the information provided to the school will contain data based on background information. This anonymous data will be provided to CESA for reporting and consideration of support for schools.

How to complete the survey

- For each statement, you are asked to rate how well you think the school is performing by selecting one of six responses.
 The responses are numbered 1 to 6, with number 1 being the lowest or worst rating and number 6 being the highest or best rating.
- If you have more than one child at the school, and your perceptions differ for each child, please respond with respect to your perceptions related to the oldest child enrolled at the school.
- There are no 'right' or 'wrong' answers. Your opinion is what is wanted.
- Please answer all questions.
- Some statements may be fairly similar to other statements. Don't worry about this. Simply give your opinion about all statements.
